### Advertising your application

When applying for a new premises or club premises licence – or for a variation to an existing licence – you must advertise your application at the premises to which it applies.

You must **also** advertise it in the local press.

You must display a notice on the premises for at least 28 consecutive days. This period starts on the day after the day you gave your application to Hart District Council.

- put the notice in a prominent position at the premises (such as inside a clear, front-facing door or window)
- anyone must be able to read it easily from outside the premises
- if the premises covers an area of more than 50 square metres, you must put another identical notice every 50 metres along the perimeter of the premises where it faces any highway

The notice in the local newspaper must be published at least once during the 10 days starting the day after you gave your application to Hart District Council.

#### The notice at the premises must be:

- A4 or larger
- on pale blue paper
- printed or typed clearly in black ink at 16pt or larger
