





Dementia Support in Hart

INTRODUCTION

Being diagnosed with dementia, or starting to care for someone with dementia, can be a very daunting prospect. You may feel worried and isolated or be concerned about how you will cope financially.

This leaflet has been produced by Hart District Council to provide you with the following information:

- understanding what care needs you can get assistance with
- what financial help you may be able to access
- who can help you fill out forms
- who you can talk to about your worries
- local social and support groups for dementia sufferers and their carers

ASSESSING NEEDS

Care Needs Assessments

An assessment for care tells you what needs the person with dementia has, and what needs you may have as a carer. This care may be partly or completely paid for by your local council, or you may have to pay for this care and support yourself. The care needs assessment will help you find out what care is needed and how it will be paid for.

There are a number of ways you can request an assessment:

- Contact Hampshire County Council Adults' Health and Care
- Via your GP, social prescriber or other health care professional
- Your local befriending service may be able to help
- Citizen's Advice Hart can help you request an assessment

FINANCIAL HELP

There is a wide range of benefits and payment reductions that you, as a carer or as a dementia sufferer, may be eligible for. For help filling out form, please see the **CONTACTS** page.

Attendance Allowance

Attendance Allowance can be claimed by someone who has a disability, is over the pension age and needs supervision or help with personal care.

To request a copy of the application form call the Attendance Allowance Helpline on 0800 731 0122

PIP (Personal Independent Payment)

PIP can be claimed by someone who has care or mobility needs and are under pension age.

Carer's Allowance

Carer's allowance is a benefit that can provide extra support to people who spend at least 35 unpaid hours per week looking after (or supervising) someone else. Receiving this allowance is dependent on your receiving other certain benefits and is only available to those under state pension age.

Help with Housing Costs

You may qualify for help with your housing costs, including Council Tax, support for mortgage interest or housing benefit, if you are on a low income or receiving certain benefits.

Universal Credit

You or the person you care for may be able to get Universal Credit if you're on a low income or need help with your living costs and are under state pension age.

Pension Credit

Pension Credit may be available to you, or the dementia sufferer you care for, if you claim state pension but it is not enough for you to live on.
