Activities & Support for Autistic Children / Young Adults & their Families

Mustard Seed Autism Trust

We are a registered Charity providing support to autistic children, their parents and siblings. Our mission is to equip children, empower parents and educate society.

The first step is to self-refer to us. We accept children aged between 3 and 11 who live within Hart and Rushmoor. We take referrals directly from parents/carers only.

Our waiting list is open twice a year and will be announced on our website, in social media, through our newsletter and through local networks. We tend to take on 50 new families each time and those spaces get filled within 2 minutes, so we would recommend families follow us on social media to keep an eye on the opening date.

Courses are available for families on our waiting list; however, any local families can access our Advice Line. You will need to email us to book a call: office@mustardseedautism.co.uk Calls are up to one hour and followed up with email recommendations, signposting and resources.

BRAAIN

BRAAIN are a local support group for families who have children with ADHD / ASD, ADHD / ADD and SEN. Their <u>website</u> is packed with information and useful links as well as calendars of events & activities and support groups:

BRAAIN run an appointment service which signposts parent carers to the support that's available to them. Whether that's details of the healthcare service you'll be referred to, support that's available, training and workshop opportunities or social events specifically for families like yours. They also run a peer support group where parent carers can talk to each other about their experiences. It is an opportunity to share ideas, frustrations and experiences. It is held on the first Tuesday of every month at 8pm at the Ship Inn pub in Farnborough, 162 Ship Lane, GU14 8BE

One of the founders, Nikki, shares her story:

"I'm a special needs parent. When you realise that your child needs additional support, it's really tough, both emotionally and physically. You don't have the time or the headspace to search for hours to find the information you need to support your child. It was a huge frustration of mine when my child went through the diagnosis process. You receive a diagnosis and then are left just to manage.

That's why we set up BRAAIN. We want to help other parents at a time in their life when it's tough, really tough. We want to guide parents/carers to the support they need and help them to meet other parents/carers that have children in a similar situation."

Vision4Youth

Vision 4 Youth is a charity based in Yateley that provides youth clubs, services, training, and employment in Yateley and the surrounding areas. We have a youth centre in The Tythings in Yateley where we run various youth clubs.

Our Blue Sky Club is a calmer version of our Thursday and Friday clubs. Our doors are open for young neurodiverse people to play some pool, table tennis, air hockey, or just chill out. Numbers and dates are limited, so please <a href="mailto:emai

The Blue Sky Club runs on Wednesdays in term time from 7.00-8.00pm. It is for 11–18-year-olds and advance booking required.

Our Monday youth cafe and Tuesday creative clubs may also be suitable for those with autism. Please get in touch for a chat.

Frimley Health & Care - Get Winter Ready

Being prepared for the inevitable winter sniffles and taking greater control of your own health can help you to make the most of winter.

Enjoying good health is the result of so many different factors, from what we eat and drink to how active we are, how much sleep we get and how we interact with others.

It's also about feeling confident to manage common ailments from a well-stocked medicine cabinet and making the right choice on health services when we need them.

Community pharmacies are a great source of advice and guidance on common ailments and medication queries.

If you find you need the support of your GP healthcare team, remember you can contact them online, via the phone or in person. Your general practice team have been working hard to ensure you can get the right treatment you need at the right place and the right time, both now and in the future. Be clear on your need to be directed to the best member of the team to support you, that may not always be a doctor.

Get the NHS App to order repeat prescriptions, book and manage appointments, view your health record and find your NHS number.

Looking after your mental health is just as important as your physical health this winter. If you start to feel down or anxious it's always best to talk to someone early on.

TalkPlus - New Dads' Group

Since becoming a dad are you struggling with thoughts such as... 'I should know what to do', 'It's not about me', 'I need to be the rock', 'I shouldn't be feeling like this', 'This is not what I expected'.

Don't Worry. Becoming a new dad can be difficult, it is estimated that just as many dads experience stress, anxiety and depression after the birth of a child as mums do.

The 'New Dads' Group' facilitated by TalkPlus is an online 6-week peer support group looking at the pressure of fatherhood with the opportunity to learn tools and techniques to help manage in a supportive environment. We also look at the role of fathers, changes in relationships and baby development.

Calls and Visits

Q&A with Christine Oldfield, the founder of Calls & Visits

Please tell us a little about Calls & Visits

Calls & Visits is an entirely voluntary charity founded in 2020 with the aim of befriending isolated people in the area of Fleet. Many people find it hard to leave home and would love to have a chat with someone on a regular basis. Our mission is simple: less loneliness. Calls and Visits is part of the Good Neighbours Network, which means that we follow their quality standards. GNN has been operating in Hampshire for over 40 years and is funded by the Integrated Care Board (formally CCG).

Who do you serve? We only serve folk who are isolated due to mobility issues or frailty, who do not have the option of going out to a day centre or sitting in a library to find company. Our volunteers visit and chat, maybe play a board game or make a cup of tea. Sometimes befriending talks place on the phone instead. We do not help with jobs or take people out, because we are not set up for those services. Visits/calls tend to be once a week and the volunteer should put aside an hour, although calls are often more brief.

How are referrals made? Sometimes isolated people self-refer or a relative contacts us on our message service, email address (below) or Facebook page. More usually we are contacted by Social Prescribers by email and we send them a referral application.

What safeguarding is in place? We give basic safeguarding training to protect both the volunteer and those we befriend. Our visitors are DBS checked and references are taken up for all volunteers, who must be at least 18 years old.
