- In receipt of Income Support or Universal Credit
- Families with school age children in receipt of free school meals
- Having a learning difficulty and/or disability
- Who are at risk of/have mental health needs

Veterans, ex-military personnel and family members



Have you, or someone in your family, been a member of the Armed Forces?



The Armed Forces Covenant is a promise from the nation that those who serve or have served in the Armed Forces, and their families, are treated fairly. As a reservist, veteran or a family member there is a range of local support available to you. Your work coach has access to a local 'Armed Forces Champion' and can let you know what support there is available locally - Government-services-for-the-armed-forces-and-their-families

Career Transition Partnership (CTP) is the official resettlement service for the Armed Forces, bringing together expert personal support, employers and training providers to help those who serve resettle into civilian life. They provide a range of support specifically designed to help service leavers with their resettlement including a range of guidance, training courses, digital tools, resettlement events and access to relevant job vacancies - MOD CTP
