Home Safety at Christmas: Keep Your Festive Season Secure

The holiday season is a time for joy, but it's also a time when opportunistic crime can rise. With homes full of gifts and many people away visiting family, it's important to take a few simple steps to keep your property and parcels safe.

Secure Your Deliveries

- Use safe delivery options: Choose click-and-collect or locker services where possible.
- Track parcels: Sign up for delivery alerts so you know when items arrive.
- Avoid leaving parcels in plain sight: If you're not home, ask a trusted neighbour to take them in.

Keep Your Home Secure

- Lock up properly: Double-check doors and windows before leaving, even for short trips.
- Set timers for lights: A well-lit home looks occupied. Smart plugs or timer switches can help.
- Don't advertise your absence: Avoid posting holiday plans on social media until you're back.



Protect Valuables

- Hide gifts from view: Keep presents away from windows where they can tempt thieves.
- Store packaging carefully: Boxes for expensive items left outside signal what's inside your home.

Be Neighbourly

- Look out for each other: If you're away, let a trusted neighbour know so they can keep an eye out.
- Report suspicious activity: If something doesn't look right, contact your local police or community safety team.

A few small actions can make a big difference in keeping your Christmas merry and secure!

NHS Life Cards: A Simple Tool That Could Save a Life

The festive season can be joyful, but for some, it's also a time of struggle. The NHS Life Card is a discreet, wallet-sized resource designed to provide immediate support for anyone experiencing suicidal thoughts, or for those worried about someone else.

What's on the card?

- 24/7 helpline numbers like Samaritans and Papyrus HOPELINE247
- Quick guidance on what to do in a crisis
- Local NHS mental health contacts

Why carry one?

- Fits easily in a wallet or phone case
- Offers life-saving information at a glance during moments of crisis

How to get one:
