Value for money	Are the project costs reasonable and clearly linked to project activities? Have applicants demonstrated how a relatively small amount of funding will make a meaningful difference for residents?				

Sustainable beyond project funding	Does the project demonstrate how benefits will continue beyond the funding period, through skills, partnerships, volunteer involvement, or future funding plans?				
Impact on the environment	Do projects with a neutral or negative impact describe ways in which they can mitigate to show alternative positive impacts?
