The examiner will retain the data until we have made the relevant statutory decisions on whether to adopt the plan and the deadline for a Judicial Review has passed, which is six weeks after the decision notice has been published.

- The gap preserves the separate identity of Crookham Village and allows inhabitants to have a sense of local community.
- Infill developments will undoubtedly erode the sense of community, character and beauty that Crookham Village currently enjoys.
- It has always been clear in all previous consultations that the local gap is very important to the residents of Crookham Village.

The local footpaths are valuable and widely used. I personally use them regularly and often see local villagers walking and enjoying the countryside. The gaps around the village give a great sense of getting away from the busyness of local towns, providing fresh open spaces and a place to feel in contact with nature. I live in the Basingstoke Canal conservation area and some

of the gaps connect with this to provide uninterrupted beautiful walks which can be benefited by the whole community.

The gap between Crookham Village and Fleet has already been eroded by the new developments at Grove Farm and Watery lane and it is very important to preserve the remaining gaps.

Probably the most significant benefit of maintaining the gaps is the separation between Crookham Village, Fleet and Dogmersfield. Allowing all to be distinctive and maintaining their unique characters. It would be awful to lose this.
