The footpaths in the south of the village gap (cross farm) enable residents to get exercise, walk to the canal & woods, experience nature and most importantly are safe. The roads around the village are narrow and not safe for walking. This gap ensures my children get exercise and fresh air, learn about nature (we enjoy butterfly spotting in the summer months on this gap) and are not at danger from traffic (cars and cyclists) on the roads.

The settlement gap to the north has been shrinking due to the large housing development that has started (sept 19) along hitches lane, my children are upset as their school field at

all saints junior school is being built on due the housing development, making the gap to the south extremely extremely important for the local community especially children and their health.

These gaps keep the historic character of the linear village, we do not have a village green therefore the green gaps surrounding the village are essential and are utilised frequently by local residents and visitors.
