**I strongly support maintaining the Settlement Gaps around the village and protecting them from further development.**

**Crookham village is a ribbon development in a rural environment – if development were to be pursued in these gaps then Crookham village would be completely absorbed into the suburbs of Fleet and would no longer be a village with any identity. Any further development creep into these areas will make the destruction of the village inevitable.**

**These gaps provide a valuable natural resource to the people of Fleet, Dogmersfield, Church Crookham as well as Crookham village itself. There are beautiful walks available across fields and countryside, to and from the canal allowing a respite from the noise and bustle of the town and they give access to nature to adults and children alike – and all of it accessible by foot, or a short cycle ride to many thousands of people.**

**Filling in these gaps will mean people having to go further and further, needing to drive and so emitting CO<sub>2</sub>, NO<sub>2</sub>, CO and particulates – further damaging local and national air quality, affecting people’s health and contributing to global warming.**

**With the country (theoretically) committed to going Carbon Neutral by the middle of the century, these small oases will be essential to enable people to access countryside without contributing further to global warming, and also as a carbon sink. But not least they provide an environment where at least a little bit of nature can live alongside human development at a time when the environment is under enormous pressure.**
