I strongly support Policy NE01 and the new Appendix 3 with supporting evidence.

Crookham Village has a distinct historic but unpretentious character and linear layout providing a unique identity or Sense of Place, when perceived in context within its full Landscape Scale. This can be best understood when looking or moving into, through or out of the 'old village' - either on one of the four roads (with important glimpses of deep countryside between properties), or on one of the popular public footpaths that whisk you so quickly out into tranquillity.

The landscape setting allows you to definitely 'arrive' at or 'leave' the village and this individual identity is evident day and night, supported by deliberately sparse village street lighting (specified by local people) and comparatively dark skies. The fields to the north give important breathing space up to the natural boundary of ancient woodland including Netherhouse Copse SSSI, beyond which is being developed and must not coalesce.

Walkers from the village and surrounding area are drawn to the network of paths through the surrounding open spaces for the enjoyment and unspoken but real sense of wellbeing and freedom this immediately gives. You are instantly immersed in beauty and birdsong, which are an important Quality of Life indicator.

Rising a few metres on Footpath One to the south, you are quickly rewarded by far reaching views left to elevated parts of the Thames basin Heaths SPA near Farnborough and Aldershot, forwards towards Beacon Hill and Ewshot, and right towards Crondall. The rolling landscape setting is unique and diverse, ever-changing with the seasons and sustaining a surprising array of wild flora and fauna. This is a connected landscape, with attractive corridors linking the Basingstoke Canal, woodlands, marsh, mixed hedgerows and grassland or arable into one landscape.

We have lived in Crookham village for over 20 years and there have been changes that we accept, but the core strength and unique identity of this place is its context in the landscape - and long may it continue.
