This chapter outlines the development of the settlement from Saxon times (evidenced by the discovery of the "Crondall Hoard" of Saxon coins), through Roman occupation and the Norman Conquest and on through the Civil War and two World Wars to the present day. For over 2,000 years the village has retained its original Saxon street plan, centred on the Church, the old Manor Farm and the Borough. This is a precious heritage asset and I support the Plan is giving the history of the village a central role.**

The trees and green space on the left of the road into the village from Bowling Alley are a valuable asset to the village setting. This entrance route would be wrecked by any building beyond the stream, which would destroy the rural view from the road.**
